Dieback Working Group's GREEN CARD Training Biosecurity

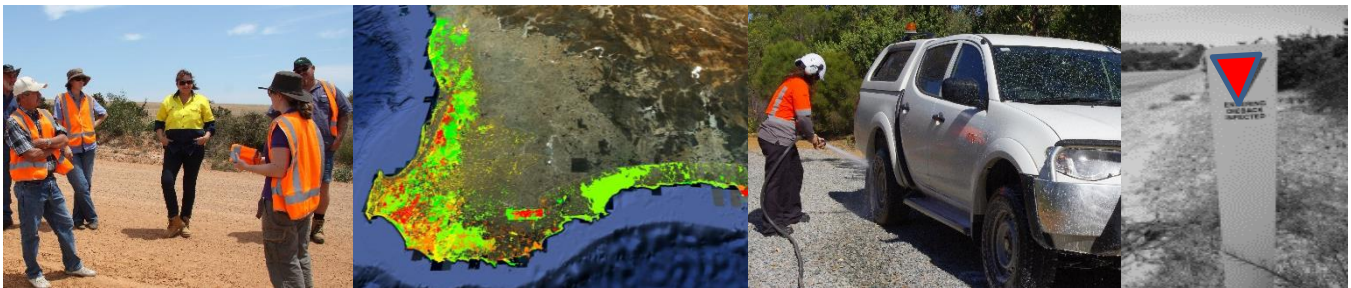


CONSIDERED ESSENTIAL for anyone managing, working in, or entering natural bushland areas. This training is becoming the “New” requirement in bushland biosecurity. Developed with support from the Department of Parks and Wildlife (WA) and delivered by specialists, you will learn necessary skills and knowledge to mitigate a range of serious Biosecurity Threats using ‘Phytophthora Dieback’ as one common example.

Learning Outcomes:

- Understand key biosecurity threats to WA’s native vegetation.
- Understand the nature, spread and impacts of *Phytophthora cinnamomi*.
- Knowledge of relevant laws, regulations and key management documents.
- Learn effective Biosecurity Hygiene practices you can implement immediately.

Trainees will undertake both theoretical and practical-based learning and assessment. Trainees will be required to demonstrate your competency to be awarded a Certificate of Completion and DPaW recognised **Green Card**.
